## Script 16 Expressing and Justifying an Opinion Effectively

Before you begin your oral interaction, have a look at how these students did it. You can note some of the expressions they use to help you initiate and maintain conversations as well as interrupt politely.

**REMEMBER:** 

-MAKE SURE EVERYONE GETS A CHANCE TO INTERACT.

-DON'T JUST GIVE YOUR INDIVIDUAL OPINION, REACT TO WHAT OTHER PEOPLE ARE SAYING.

-IF YOU HAVE TO INTERRUPT SOMEONE, MAKE SURE YOU DO SO POLITELY. -MAKE SURE EVERYONE GETS TO EXPRESS THEIR IDEAS TO THE FULLEST.

St 1: Hello, my name is \_\_ . Every student identifies himself or herself with their first name. (Introduce yourselves)

St 2: Ok, so can someone repeat what the task is? (Ask questions / clarify the task)

St 3: Yes, we need to pick a question and discuss our answers or opinions. When we're finished with one, we can choose another. We have to interact for 15 minutes.



St 4: Is everyone ready? Do you have any questions?

St 1: Do we have to answer all the questions in 15 minutes?

St 3-4: No.

St 2: Ready? Ok, so I want to start with question number 2: Using examples from the unit, explain if you agree or disagree with this quote.''W... (Initiate: Propose and give an initial opinion)

St 3:You said you agreed, but can you please explain why? (Help the conversation move further)

St 1: Yes, I agree because... (Justify your opinions)

St 3: What you say is true. For example, during the unit we saw that... (Support your opinions with examples from the unit)

St 4: Yes, but don't forget that... (React and add to what others are saying)

St 3: Oh, I'm sorry, that's not what I meant. What I mean is... (Politely interrupt / Clarify meaning)

St 4: Ah, uh yes, that's a good point, but ... (Bring new ideas or aspects to the discussion)



St 1: Are we finished with this question? If we're done, we can move on to another one...

(Ask if others are finished before moving to another question)

\*ALL STUDENTS AGREE\*

St 1: so how about question number 5: Does risking or giving one's life for a cause add value to a person's message?

\*Students continue discussion\*

St 1: Ok, so we are almost at 15 minutes...

St 2: Nice work everyone...

St 3: Yes, thanks for asking me questions, it helped me develop my ideas.

St 4: No problem.

St 1: Ok, don't forget to...

St 2: oh, yes, we have to submit...

Together closing: BYE!
