- Make sure you have received the information from your teacher concerning risk situation that may be encountered in this module. If necessary, confirm the manoeuvre with your teacher prior to executing it so as to ensure it is done in a safe manner.
- When outside the truck, you should wear gloves to avoid injury and keep clean. If you wear gloves, your hands will be clean when you touch the steering wheel and various switches inside the cab.
- To avoid falling or injuring yourself, face the truck and use the three support points when getting into and out of the cab.
- To prevent the vehicle from moving during inspections, make sure that the parking brake is engaged. Watch closely for vehicle movement when testing the brakes.

NB: Remember to wear your safety vest and safety boots.


CIRCLE CHECK INSPECTION PROCEDURE

Occupational Safety and Health

During a pre-trip inspection, it is vitally important that you follow basic occupational safety and health regulations:

- **Wear required personal protective equipment:** gloves and safety vest.
- **Parking brake:** Always make sure that the parking brake is engaged before you do inspections around the vehicle.
- **Getting into and out of the vehicle:**
 - Use devices provided to help you safely get into and out of the vehicle, if available;
 - Always face the vehicle and use the three support points;
 - Do not jump down from the vehicle.
- **Tire inspection:** Use a hammer to check the tires.
- **Hood opening and closing:**
 - Check the weight of the component;
 - Make sure it is securely closed;
 - Make sure you have enough space in front to open the hood.
- **Climbing onto the vehicle (e.g., using a tire):** Avoid climbing up on external parts of the vehicle, but if it is necessary to do so, take extra precautions.
- **Do not carry out work on the engine while it is running.**

These aspects are part of the competency to be developed and will be checked regularly during your training.

Step 3 : Vehicle interior inspection 1st part

Proper starting sequence (see procedure)

Lower the air pressure to activate the low air pressure warning devices (55 lb/po²)
Check the windshield and both side windows
Check rear view mirrors condition
Windshield wipers and washer system are working properly
Windshield blower (defroster) is working properly
No exhaust leaks inside the cab
Steering column and steering wheel are solid
Power steering is working properly
One or all the horns are working
Seat
Seat belt condition
Push hard on the service brake pedal
Check air compressor efficiency (at or above 90 lb/po²)
Check air compressor disengagement (between 117 lb/po² and 137 lb/po²)
Stop the engine
Check for air leaks (less than 6 lb/po² in 1 minute)
Star the engine
Lower air pressure by 20 lb/po ² below the compressor disengagement pressure
Check the air compressor engagement (above 80 lb/po²)
Apply the parking brake
Stop the engine
Turn on all position light and low beam
Turn on the right turn signal

BRAKE TEST PROCEDURE WEDLEPS

- ▶ The truck must be stable during the procedure.
- ▶ Follow the steps with the engine turned on and the parking break released.

W Low air pressure warning 55 psi MINOR	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Apply the tractor's parking brake (pull yellow button) only. 2. By repeatedly applying the brake pedal, lower the air pressure in the system so that you hear the buzzer and/or see the warning light come on. <p>Minor defect if you do not hear the buzzer or if the warning light does not come on when the air pressure in the braking system falls below 55 psi.</p>
E Efficiency 90 psi MAJOR	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Press firmly and hold the brake pedal while watching the air pressure gauge. Check that the compressor is compensating (the air pressure is equal to or greater than 90 psi). <p>Major defect if the compressor does not reach or maintain a pressure of at least 90 psi in the brake system.</p>
D <i>Disengagement</i> 117 psi to 137 psi MINOR	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Release the tractor (push yellow button) or tractor and semi-trailer (push yellow and red button) parking brake, depending whether or not the vehicle is hitched. 2. Maintain sufficient pressure on the brakes so that the truck does not move. 3. Make sure that the compressor is in its pumping cycle. 4. Wait until the air pressure has stopped rising by watching the air pressure gauge or going by the sound of the air dryer releasing. <p>Minor defect if the compressor does not stop working when the air pressure reaches a point between 117 psi and 137 psi.</p>
L Leakage >6 psi or > 7 psi MAJOR	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Before releasing the brake pedal, check the airtightness of the air system by observing the gauge and/or, by listening for a leak in the system. 2. If you observe a leak, keep pressing firmly on the brake pedal for one minute and calculate the leak. <p>Major defect if air leak is > 6 psi for a tractor. Minor defect if air leak is > 3 psi for a tractor. Minor defect if air leak is > 4 psi for a tractor semi-trailer. Major defect if air leak is > 7 psi for a tractor semi-trailer.</p>
E <i>Engagement</i> 80 psi MINOR	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Apply the brakes a few times if necessary to lower the air pressure enough so that the compressor begins operating. 2. Maintain sufficient pressure on the brakes so that the truck does not move 3. Watch the air pressure gauge to see if the compressor begins operating. <p>Minor defect if the compressor begins operating at 80 psi or less.</p>

P Parking brake MINOR	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Keep the tractor's brake applied (yellow button is pulled out) and check whether the parking brake light is on. In the case of a tractor semi-trailer, the parking brakes must be checked on the tractor first and then on the semi-trailer. 2. Gently try to ease the vehicle forward or backward to see whether or not the parking brake holds the vehicle. <p>Minor defect if parking brake does not hold vehicle back at all when you attempt to move it.</p>
S Service brake MAJOR	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Release the parking brake. 2. Drive a few metres forward or backwards slowly (depending on obstacle) while watching the wheel rotation in the rear-view mirrors and then stop the vehicle. <p>Major defect if the service brake does not stop the vehicle.</p>

AUTOMATIC SLACK ADJUSTERS ADJUSTMENT PROCEDURE

(from the vehicle's cab)

- Make sure that the truck is on a flat surface before starting the procedure.
- During the procedure, the air pressure in the tanks must always be above **90 psi**.
- Make sure that the vehicle is immovable (use wheel blocks or turn off the engine and put the clutch into a low gear).
- The brakes must be cold.

Tractor only

- Release the parking brake.
- Push the service brake as far as it will go and wait **at least three seconds**.
- Release the service brake and wait **at least three seconds**.
- Repeat several times as needed and check the adjustment.

Semi-trailer only

- Release the parking brake of the semi-trailer.
- Engage the semi-trailer service brake using the hand brake (BENDIX) and wait **at least three seconds**.
- Release the service brake and wait **at least three seconds**.
- Repeat several times as needed and check the adjustment.


Tractor and semi-trailer together

(not recommended because it requires too much air pressure consumption)

- Release the parking brakes of the tractor and semi-trailer.
- Press the service brake pedal as far as it will go and wait **at least three seconds**.
- Release the service brake and wait **at least three seconds**.
- Repeat several times as needed and check the adjustment.

NB: Always consult a mechanic if you have doubts about the operation of the automatic slack adjuster system.

CLUTCH PEDAL TRAVEL PLAY



ENGINE START-UP PROCEDURE

1. Make sure that the parking brake is engaged.
2. Put the gearshift of the transmission in NEUTRAL.
3. Press the clutch pedal.
4. Turn the ignition key to ON.
5. Press the start-up button or turn the ignition key.
 Make the engine turn over until it starts.
6. Make sure that the oil pressure rises in less than 15 seconds. If it does not, shut off the engine and see your instructor.

NB: A more detail procedure will be looked at in Module 2.

PROCEDURE – HITCHING A SEMI-TRAILER

HEALTH AND SAFETY

REMEMBER TO ALWAYS APPLY THESE RULES :

- **Personal safety equipment:** gloves, safety vest, and safety boots.
- **Parking brake:** Always make sure the the parking brake is applied before inspecting your vehicles.
- **Climbing on and off the vehicle :**
 - Use the required equipment when available;
 - Always face the vehicle and use the 3 point rule;
 - Do not jump off the vehicle.
- **Walking around the vehicle :**
 - Always walk facing the danger;
 - Do not cross-over under the semi-trailer.
- **Safety when backing up:**
 - Use the 4-way flashers;
 - Both side windows must be open.

Step 1 : Approach and hitching

Tractor :

- Place the tractor in a straight line with the semi-trailer
- Stop once the back wheels are underneath the semi-trailer
- Shut off engine if necessary
- Apply the parking brake

Fifth wheel :

- Verify the height of the trailer compared to the fifth-wheel
- Verify the angle of the fifth-wheel
- Verify that the kingpin is centered with the fifth-wheel
- Verify that the kingpin is not damaged (section 1) *
- Verify that the kingpin plate is not damaged (section 1)
- Verify the fifth wheel is unlocked
- Verify the trailer's underside and cross members (section 2)
- **Enter the cabin and start the engine.**
- **Release the parking brake and back up until the fifth-wheel locks.**
- **Pull forward with the tractor to confirm the fifth-wheel is locked, apply the parking brake, and turn off the headlights, shut off the engine.**
 - Verify the fifth wheel jaws and the locking mechanisms (section 1)
- Plug-in the 3 cables into the semi-trailer
- Start the engine.
- Supply air to the semi-trailer by pressing the red parking brake button
 - Let the pressure attain its maximum (compressor shut off)
 - Wait until the pressure is stable in the system
 - Compressor may have to turn on again, wait until it shuts off again (*This may take several minutes until the system is stable.*)
- Apply the brake on the semi-trailer
- Shut off the engine
- Turn on the parking lights and the right turn signal
- Proceed to inspect the truck

* The elements in parentheses () are references to the *Circle Check Guide* and *Driving a Heavy Vehicle (DHV)*.

Part 2 : Circle check (part 1)

- Verify the registration and SAAQ inspection tag on the truck
- Lift the landing gear verifying both sides are up

Carefully inspect the following elements :

- Fixed elements of the chassis (section 2)
- Top and bottom chassis as well as cross members (section 2)
- Sub frame and locking pins (section 2)

- Tires and valves (section 9)
- Wheels and nuts (section 12)
- Wheel hub lubricant (section 12)
- Suspension : air bags, leafs and other parts (section 14)
- Parking lights (section 8)
- Right side turn signal (section 8)
- License plate light (section 8)
- Fixed parts on the body (section 2)
- Brake push rod (Indicator should be in the middle of both indicators)

- Cargo securement and verifying the doors are well secured (norme 10)
- Verify the doors are locked at the top and bottom

Verify the same components on the right side of the semi-trailer

Part 3 : Circle check (part 2)

Climb onboard; activate the left signal light, continuer with the following elements.

- Left signal light (section 8)
- Brake lights with the brake pedal (section 8)

Step 4 : Cabin

Climb onboard for the following elements

- Semi-trailer parking brake efficiency (section 19)
- Release of semi-trailer parking brake (section 19)
In a safe area
- Semi-trailer service brake efficiency (section 19)
In a safe area
- With both parking brakes released, proceed with the efficiency and leakage test
- Apply the parking brake on both vehicle

Step 5 : Documents

- Complete the necessary documents (paper form or electronic)

Step 1 : Parking and inspection of the semi-trailer

- Parking the semi-trailer at an appropriate spot
- Apply the parking brake
- Shut off the engine

Proceed with the following inspection starting on the passenger's side :

- Tires and wheels
- Suspension : air bags, suspension arm, u-bolt
- Parking lights
- 4-way flashers
- License plate light
- Deflate the suspension
- Purge the air tanks
- Repeat the procedures for the same elements on either side of the semi-trailer

- Lower the landing gear about 3 centimeters from the ground making sure both sides were lowered
- Disconnect the cables
- Unlock the fifth-wheel

Step 2: Cabin - Unhitching

Prepare to move the tractor forward :

- Release the parking brake, engage the transmission into first gear
 - Identify the suspension pressure gauge as well as the switch to lower the suspension
-
- **Activate** the switch to lower the suspension and wait until the pressure is down to 5psi (Usual pressure for a bobtail tractor)
-
- Proceed forward until the trailer is off the fifth wheel and above the back axle
-
- Confirm that the trailer is stable
-
- Reactivate the suspension as you move away from the trailer

Step 3 : Storing the tractor after work

- Park the tractor in a safe place, apply the parking brake and shut off the engine

Verify the following elements:

- Tires and wheels
- Suspension parts : air bags, leafs, u-bolts
- Parking lights
- Signal lights
- Headlights
- Any element that might be out of place
- Purge the air tanks
- Shut off all the lights
- Close the windows and lock the doors



DIFFERENT REASONS TO DISPLACE THE AXLE

- Distribute the weight evenly among the different axles
- Facilitate tight turns.

ALWAYS VERIFY THAT THE PARKING BRAKE IS APPLIED ON THE TRACTOR AND TRAILER BEFORE EXITING THE VEHICLE.

Axe displacement
➤ Park on level ground with the tractor aligned with the trailer
➤ Apply the parking brake
➤ Deflate the suspension on the semi-trailer
➤ Unlock the locking pins on the chassis
➤ Confirm that all 4 locking pins are unlocked
➤ Verify that the cables underneath the semi-trailer has sufficient length to reach the axle
➤ Plan your execution manoeuvre before proceeding (guide bar, mark on the chasis, etc.)
➤ Release the tractor parking brake and move forward or backwards depending on your strategy
➤ Release the semi-trailer's locking pins
➤ Visually confirm that the 4 locking pins have been released
➤ Inflate the semi-trailer suspension
➤ Confirm the weight transfer by driving onto a weigh scale



FOLLOWER TRUCK INSTRUCTIONS (MODULE 8 AND 9)

1. Follow the lead truck (teacher) at any time and from a safe distance.

-Avoid using the cruise control.

-Use with respect and civility the engine brake (If equipped).

2. If you lose sight with the lead truck, contact your teacher through the radio transmitter (FM) and stay with the initial itinerary establish with your teacher at time of departure.

-At all times, it is forbidden to make U-turns in an unauthorized places such as: shopping center, Transport Company or other private property, even if there is enough space to perform a turning maneuver;

You must remain on public roads.

3. If you have been authorized by your teacher to continue your route and you arrive at your destination before the lead truck:

- 1. Follow the lead truck (teacher) at any time and from a safe distance.**
 - Avoid using the cruise control.
 - Use with respect and civility the engine brake (If equipped).
- 2. If you lose sight with the lead truck, contact your teacher through the radio transmitter (FM) and stay with the initial itinerary establish with your teacher at time of departure.**
 - At all times, **it is forbidden** to make U-turns in an unauthorized places such as: shopping center, Transport Company or other private property, even if there is enough space to perform a turning maneuver;

You must remain on public roads.
- 3. If you have been authorized by your teacher to continue your route and you arrive at your destination before the lead truck:**
 - Always be in contact radio with your teacher.
 - Do not enter a company premises without the presence of your teacher.
 - Wait for your teacher, park a bit away on the public road and activate the emergency flashers.
 - Advise your teacher, that you have reached your destination.
 - Do not start any back-up maneuvers to a company premises, without the presence of your teacher.

FOLLOWER TRUCK INSTRUCTIONS

(MODULE 8 AND 9)(Next)

- 4. If you are lost and you cannot contact your teacher, go to an address that you had pre-determined with your teacher before departure or return to your CFTR Center and wait for the return of your teacher.**

OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- You are responsible for your actions on the roads.
- Confirm that, no restrictions apply to your vehicle before you commit yourself on a road segment. (Ex. NO TRUCK or TRANSIT).
- If a weigh station is open (flashing lights), you must enter and pass on the scale.
- As a training center, we are still obliged by the rules and laws of the Road Safety Code. Tickets can still be issued to students by the police or the DOT law enforcers.
- You must comply with these rules in the best interests and safety of all.
- You will have to sign a document to that effect during the initial training or during the presentation of the CFTR code of conduct.



REAR-VIEW MIRROR Adjustment

Since a tractor type truck is designed to pull a semi-trailer, it is essential that the semi-trailer be hitched to the tractor before you can properly adjust the rear-view mirrors.

NB: With a bobtail tractor, efforts to see the sides of the vehicle as well as the tires in flat rear-view mirrors, is considered normal.

- a) BE COMFORTABLE: Adjust the driver's seat and the steering wheel so that you can easily reach the pedals and vehicle controls;
- b) VEHICLE ALIGNMENT: The tractor and the semi-trailer must be correctly aligned straight with one another;
- c) HORIZONTAL VIEW: Adjust the flat rear-view mirrors so that you just barely see the sides of the semi-trailer without having to make an effort to see them;
- d) VERTICAL VIEW: Adjust the flat rear-view mirrors so that, without making an effort, you can obtain a distant rear view and be able to see the tires of the semi-trailer from the moment you start making a turn;
- e) CONVEX REAR-VIEW MIRRORS: Adjust the convex rear-view mirrors so that they cover as effectively as possible the areas (blind spots) that the flat rear-view mirrors do not cover.



2 ENGAGING THE TRANSMISSION

- a) Press the service brake and release the parking brake;
- b) Press the clutch pedal to the floor;
- c) Wait a few seconds to allow the transmission gear assembly to stop turning;
- d) Engage the transmission.

3 MOVING THE VEHICLE (On a Flat Road)

- a) Engage the transmission;
- b) Release the clutch gently until you reach the friction point;
- c) Release the service brake;
- d) Continue to gently release the clutch;
- e) Then smoothly press the accelerator.

4 DOUBLE CLUTCH GEAR-SHIFTING

The double clutch gear-shifting method, implies that you must press the clutch pedal twice when shifting gears, as follows:

- a) Press the clutch pedal until you slightly exceed the friction point (avoid pressing the clutch too far);
- b) Release the clutch pedal so as to establish contact with the gear (slightly above the friction point);
- c) Clutch pedal, accelerator and gear-shift lever movements must be perfectly synchronized (i.e. same time).

5 FIND THE RPM GAP

- a) Select the lowest gear in the upper range;
- b) Keep the engine speed constant at 1,500 RPM;
- c) Take note of the vehicle speed;
- d) Shift into the next highest gear;
- e) Adjust the vehicle speed as previously noted;
- f) Take note of the engine speed;
- g) Calculate the difference in RPM between the two engine speeds observed (gap).

NB: *The gap is a guide, which may vary from one gear to the next.*

6 UPSHIFTING

The RPM gap is controlled by the actual gear shift lever movement (Smooth Tempo) which, is itself governed by the speed at which the (RPM) decreases.

- a) Maintain an even speed on the accelerator;
- b) Press the clutch pedal;
- c) Decrease pressure on the accelerator; and
- d) At the same time move the gear shift into neutral;
- e) Then release the clutch; and
- f) Press the clutch again while at the same time
- g) Moving the gear shift into the next highest gear;
- h) Then release clutch pedal gently past the friction point; and
- i) Gradually increase pressure on the accelerator.

7 DOWNSHIFTING

- a) Maintain an even speed on the accelerator;
- b) Press the clutch pedal;
- c) Decrease pressure on the accelerator; and
- d) At the same time move the gear shift into neutral;
- e) Then release the clutch; and
- f) Increase the engine speed and as soon as the engine speed is about to match the gear speed;
- g) Press the clutch again while at the same time
- h) Moving the gear shift into the next lowest gear;
- i) Maintain an even speed on the accelerator;
- j) Then release clutch pedal; and
- k) Gradually increase pressure on the accelerator.

8 GEAR RANGE SELECTOR

Example: 13-speed transmission

UPSHIFTING

With the transmission in 4th gear, lift the range selector and shift into 5th gear.

DOWNSHIFTING

With the transmission in 5th gear, lower the range selector and shift into 4th gear.

NB: Gear Range Selector becomes effective only when the gear shift lever passes through neutral.

9 KEY POINT MARKERS

Key point markers allow you a fast recovery following a missed gear change.


- Select the last gear in the lower range;
- Note the engine speed when the vehicle speed is, for example, 20 km/h;
- Then note what the vehicle speed was in the previous gear and in the next highest gear when the engine speed is identical to the previously noted speed.

Example: Truck 3091 (18-speed transmission)

- 3rd gear at 1,150 RPM \approx 15 km/h
- 4th gear at 1,150 RPM \approx 20 km/h
- 5th gear at 1,150 RPM \approx 27 km/h

10 GAP VARIATION (Based on RPM)

Example: 18-speed transmission (6 HI and 5 HI)



11 PROGRESSIVE SHIFTING

LOWER RANGE

Change gears as soon as possible while gently and gradually increasing the engine speed as you shift into the higher gears.

HIGHER RANGE

Increase the engine speed so that the pick-up occurs at an RPM slightly higher than the rated torque.

12 UPSHIFTING using SPLIT GEARS(Splitter)

IN THE SAME GEAR

- Place the gear selector in HI position;
- Decrease pressure on the accelerator while
- Pressing the clutch pedal;
- Release the clutch pedal; and
- Gradually increase pressure on the accelerator.

FROM ONE GEAR TO THE NEXT

- Place the gear selector in LO position; and
- Change gears as you would for normal upshifting.

NB: Since the RPM gap decreases by half, change gears more quickly.

13 DOWNSHIFTING using SPLIT GEARS(Splitter)

IN THE SAME GEAR

- Place the gear selector in LO position;
- Gently decrease pressure on the accelerator while
- Pressing the clutch pedal;
- Release the clutch pedal; and
- Immediately increase pressure on the accelerator.

FROM ONE GEAR TO THE NEXT

- Place the gear selector in HI position; and
- Change gears as you would for normal downshifting.


NB: Since the RPM gap decreases by half, increase pressure on the accelerator proportionately.

14 DOUBLE DOWNSHIFT (on flat road)

Resulting from an important speed loss, it may be necessary to do a “double downshift.” When double downshifting, your engine speed must be low enough so the engine can go through two RPM gaps.

NB: You can even jump several gears if the engine speed is low enough when you begin double downshifting to allow you to go through the appropriate number of RPM ranges.

15 Typical VARIATIONS RPM GAP on HILLS



16 MOVING THE VEHICLE (Incline Grade)

UPHILL GRADE

- Shift into the lowest gear of the transmission that will easily put the vehicle into motion;
- Continue gear shifting as you would on a flat road stretch.

DOWNSHILL GRADE

Select the gear that allows you to compensate for the vehicle's natural tendency to move due to the force of gravity.

Example: Select 3rd gear if the vehicle has a 10-gear transmission and 2nd gear if the vehicle has a 13-gear or 18-gear transmission.

17 UPSHIFTING GEARS (Incline Grade)

FIRST GEAR CHANGE

To prevent the vehicle from stopping while you upshift the gears, you must change gears quickly. To do that, the RPM range must be small; so increase the engine speed to a maximum of 1,000 RPM.

SUBSEQUENT GEAR CHANGES

Since the RPM range increases as you up shift gears on an incline grade, you must compensate by increasing the engine speed by 100 to 300 RPM more than would be on a flat road stretch. By using this method, you prevent the engine from losing torque as it gain speed.

18 UPSHIFTING GEARS (Downhill Grade)

ONE GEAR AT A TIME

Since gravity causes the vehicle to accelerate, the RPM gap decreases and the gear change is done more quickly than you would on a flat road stretch.

NB: Do not use half gears in the lower range. It is not always indicated that they should be used in the higher range.

JUMPING A GEAR

Jump a gear to compensate for the vehicle's acceleration due to the force of gravity.

NB: The speed at which you change gears will be closer to what it would be on a flat road stretch

19 DOWNSHIFTING GEARS (Downhill Grade)

Since gravity causes the vehicle to accelerate, the RPM gap decreases and it is therefore essential to down shift gears at the lowest engine speed in order to maintain a safety margin when the engine RPM increases.

Brake until the engine speed is a maximum 1,000 RPM before downshifting gears.

NB: Determining factors for successful downshifting on a downhill grade are proportional pressure on the accelerator and quick gear shifting.

NB: Do not downshift a half gear in the same gear when going down a downhill grade (e.g., from 6 HI to 6 LO).

20
TORQUE MANAGEMENT
(Incline Grade)

NB: Downshift gears only if the engine is unable to maintain the maximum rated peak torque RPM

NB: Keep an eye on the engine temperature gauges and downshift one gear if the temperature is too high:

- Cooling fluid: About 220°F
- Exhaust gas: About 1,000°F

GRADE WITH UP TO 10% INCLINE

Allow the engine speed to decrease to the rated peak torque before downshifting.

GRADE WITH MORE THAN 10% INCLINE

Downshift gears when the engine speed is about 100 to 200 RPM higher than the rated torque.

DOWNSHIFTING GEARS INCLINE GRADE
(UPHILL)

ONE GEAR AT A TIME

When downshifting gears on an incline grade, the force of gravity causes the vehicle to lose speed, resulting in a smaller RPM range.

NB: Determining factors for successful downshifting on an uphill grade are proportional pressure on the accelerator and quick gear shifting.

JUMPING A GEAR


Jump a gear to compensate for the vehicle's substantial loss of speed due to the force of gravity (on steep hills).

Allow the engine speed to decrease to the rated peak torque and jump a gear. The RPM range is almost similar to what it would be for normal downshifting on a slight uphill grade.


22 LEFT TURNS

- a) Turn on your left turn signal at the appropriate time;
- b) Position your vehicle in the appropriate traffic lane based on space availability and the required space for a safe and proper turning maneuver;
- c) Shift into an appropriate gear (e.g., 4th gear if your vehicle has a 10-speed transmission);
- d) Maintain the engine speed at about 1,100 RPM;
- e) Alternately, keep an eye on the front of your vehicle, the semi-trailer wheels and the intersection;
- f) Steer your vehicle into the closest left traffic lane that you can use;
- g) Do not upshift gears when the tractor and the semi-trailer form a sharp open angle to one another;
- h) Turn off the turn signal when the turn is completed.

Turning path usually followed with a 48-foot or 53-foot semi-trailer




Turning path recommended by the SAAQ, but rarely possible with a 48-foot or 53-foot semi-trailer


Special LEFT TURNS

- a) Turn on your left turn signal at the appropriate time;
- b) Position your vehicle in the appropriate traffic lane based on space availability and the required space for a safe and proper turning maneuver;
- c) Use a gear that is appropriate for the situation;
- d) Maintain the engine speed at about 1,100 RPM;
- e) Alternately, keep an eye on the front of your vehicle, the semi-trailer wheels and the intersection;
- f) Steer your vehicle into the appropriate traffic lane;
- g) Do not upshift gears when the tractor and the semi-trailer form a sharp open angle to one another;
- h) Turn off the turn signal when the turn is completed.


- a) Turn on your right turn signal at the appropriate time;
- b) Position your vehicle in the appropriate traffic lane based on space availability and the required space for a safe and proper turning maneuver;
- c) Use an appropriate gear (e.g., 3rd gear if your vehicle has a 10-speed transmission);
- d) Maintain the engine speed at about 1,100 RPM;
- e) Alternately, keep an eye on the front of your vehicle, the semi-trailer wheels and the intersection;
- f) Steer your vehicle so that it enters the right-hand lane without the semi-trailer wheels going up on the sidewalk, onto the shoulder or into the adjacent lane;
- g) Do not upshift gears when the tractor and the semi-trailer form a sharp open angle to one another;
- h) Turn off the turn signal when the turn is completed.

Right TURNS with YIELDING OF RIGHT OF WAY

- a) Turn on your right turn signal at the appropriate time;
- b) Slow down your vehicle and position it in the right-hand lane based on space availability and the required space for a safe and proper turning manoeuvre;
- c) Downshift into the appropriate gear in the lower range (depending on the situation);
- d) Maintain the engine speed at about 1,100 RPM;
- e) Alternately, keep an eye on the front of your vehicle, the semi-trailer wheels and the intersection (Watch for vehicles coming from your left);
- f) Yield the right of way, if necessary;
- g) Steer your vehicle so that it enters the right-hand lane without the semi-trailer wheels going up on the sidewalk, onto the shoulder or into the adjacent lane;
- h) Turn off the turn signal when the turn is completed.



Back-up Procedure

- 1) This procedure always applies. EXCEPT, on industrial client property, the term OBSERVER refers only to the teacher in charge of the students.
- 2) Before starting your back-up maneuver, check the environment and assure it is clear of obstacles.
- 3) Position the truck correctly according to your intended back-up location (approach).
- 4) Turn the four-way flashers on and roll down the windows to hear of any signs of danger. Trucks equipped with manual window, roll down the driver side window only.
- 5) At all time during the backup procedure select the lowest gear as possible. Do not press the accelerator while backing up.
- 6) Make sure that, the observer is in a position as such to prevent the risk of an incident or snagging. It is essential that, the observer remains within the indicated corridors as shown on the illustration below and at least 3 metres from the vehicle to be in your line of sight at all time.
- 7) Look constantly in both mirrors on both sides of the truck to make sure the trailer is moving in the right direction and to avoid any risk of snagging.
- 8) Never back up the trailer against the dock. You must stop within one metre from the dock to avoid any damages.
- 9) The observer must always have a visual contact with the driver.
- 10) The observer assisting with the backup maneuver must supervise only one (1) truck at a time. He must be positioned as shown on the illustration below, while remaining in the safety corridor outside the tractor's wheels range of motion.
- 11) It is forbidden for anyone to walk behind the semi-trailer when the unit is in motion.





BACKING UP – Steering Wheel CONTROL

You must fully understand the relationship between steering wheel movements and the direction that the semi-trailer will take when you back up the vehicle. Assuming that the bottom of the steering wheel represents the rear of the semi-trailer and the top of the steering wheel represents the front of the semi-trailer:

- a) To steer the rear of the semi-trailer to the left, turn the bottom of the steering wheel to the left;
- b) To steer the rear of the semi-trailer to the right, turn the bottom of the steering wheel to the right;
- c) To steer the front of the semi-trailer to the left, turn the top of the steering wheel to the left;
- d) To steer the front of the semi-trailer to the right, turn the top of the steering wheel to the right;




- e) To ensure that the tractor is correctly aligned with the semi-trailer, both flat rear-view mirrors views should be similar.



27 STRAIGHT LINE BACK-UP

The straight line back-up method can be used only if; there is enough room to manoeuvre in front of the corridor. Assuming that the extension of the corridor represents a traffic lane, the approach for this back-up procedure will be similar to making a turn at an intersection.



- a) Turn on the hazard lights and lower the left-side window of the cab;
- b) Approach the corridor at an angle perpendicular to the corridor and at a distance of about 1 metre from the corridor opening (A);
- c) Drive your vehicle past the front of the corridor and select a point of reference in order to visualize the extension of the corridor;
- d) Turn your vehicle as you would at an intersection by steering the tractor into the extension of the corridor (B); picture the right side of the corridor as extending straight outwards and position your vehicle at a slight angle away from the left side line of the corridor extension, as shown below;
- e) As soon as you see the opening of the corridor in the rear-view mirror located on the turning side, straighten out the tractor semi-trailer;
- f) Start backing up and complete the backing manoeuvre.



28 ANGLE BACK-UP

The angle back-up method is used when there is not enough room to manoeuvre in front of the corridor to permit the straight line back-up manoeuvre.

- a) Turn on the hazard lights and lower the left-side window of the cab;
- b) Approach the corridor at an angle perpendicular to the corridor and at a distance of about 1 metre from the corridor opening (**A**);
- c) Turn the steering wheel at about the same time as you would if you were using the straight line method;
- d) Steer the tractor so that when the vehicle combination is in the final position (**B**), it appears to be coming out of the corridor, and be sure to
- e) Keep enough room to manoeuvre (2 to 3 metres) between the tractor and the obstacle in front of the corridor;
- f) Start backing up and complete the backing manoeuvre;
- g) At each stage of the backing manoeuvre, the position of the vehicle combination should give the impression that it is coming out of the corridor.



NB: Unless you cannot do otherwise, angle backing can be done by approaching from the right side (blind side). Right-angle backing is more difficult to execute because what the driver sees is limited to what he or she sees in the rear-view mirrors. So in order to compensate for this reduced visibility, engage the tractor parking brake, lower the right-side window of the cab and look outside to check the vehicle's position. Then back up only 2 to 3 metres at a time. If necessary, get out of the cab to check the position of the vehicle in relation to the corridor.



TIGHT SPACE BACK-UP

When the available room to manoeuvre in front of the corridor is restricted, an angle back-up can be initiated, which must be adapted with the available manoeuvring space.

- a) Turn on the hazard lights and lower the left-side window of the cab;
- b) Approach the corridor at an angle perpendicular to the corridor and at a distance of about 1 metre from the corridor opening;
- c) Turn the steering wheel when the vehicle is at a greater distance (**B**) than it would be if you were doing standard angle backing (**A**);
- d) Steer the tractor so that when the vehicle combination is in the final position (**C**), it appears to be coming out of the corridor, and be sure to
- e) Keep enough room to manoeuvre (2 to 3 metres) between the tractor and the obstacle in front of the corridor;
- f) Start backing up and complete the backing manoeuvre;
- g) At each stage of the backing manoeuvre, the position of the vehicle combination should give the impression that it is coming out of the corridor.

NB: With this back-up manoeuvre, it can be necessary to initiate the approach manoeuvre from a traffic lane, as shown below. Use caution since there might be another vehicle in a blind spot. Use all available safety methods (e.g., flagman or reflective triangles).



30

LOOK FAR AHEAD

- a) Look ahead over the distance that your vehicle will cover in the next 12 to 15 seconds;
- b) Look far ahead to avoid zigzagging of your vehicle;
- c) Look towards the centre of the traffic lane in order to keep the vehicle centred in the lane.

31

EXTEND YOUR FIELD OF VISION

- a) Look in the flat rear-view mirrors frequently, i.e., every 12 seconds or oftener;
- b) Use the convex rear-view mirrors to check your blind spots.

32

KEEP YOUR EYES MOVING(Scan)

By moving your eyes from one source of information to another, i.e., the road, pedestrians, traffic signs, dashboard, etc., you keep your brain alert.

NB: *Keeping your eyes immobile narrows your field of vision and may have a hypnotic effect.*

NB: *Do not look at an object for too long because there is a natural tendency to steer your way towards the object.*

33

MAKE SURE TO BE SEEN BY OTHERS

- a) If necessary, signal your presence by sounding the horn or flashing your headlights to attract the attention of persons whose attention may be elsewhere;
- b) Signal your intentions by using your turn signals:
 - Far enough in advance to properly indicate your intentions; and
 - Not too far in advance as it may confuse other road users;
- c) Turn on your flashing hazard lights only in emergency situations or when the vehicle poses a hazard to other road users, for example,
 - If you have to stop in an emergency;
 - If you are driving more slowly than the minimum speed limit; or
 - If you are backing up your vehicle.

34

ALWAYS HAVE AN EXIT ROUTE

WHEN YOUR VEHICLE IS STOPPED

Keep enough space between your vehicle and the vehicle preceding you so, that you can go around it, if need be, without having to back up.

ON THE ROAD

Allow an one-second interval for every three metres of your vehicle's length in order to calculate the required safe distance between your vehicle and the vehicle ahead of you.

35**CORRECT STEERING WHEEL HANDLING**

- a) Keep both hands on the steering wheel;
- b) Do not hold the steering wheel by the steering wheel spokes;
- c) Position your hand on the steering wheel so that your thumb is pointed towards the top of the steering wheel;
- d) Do not keep your hand on the gearshift lever, except when performing a quick gear changes sequence.

36**OBSERVE TRAFFIC SIGNS**

- a) Watch for traffic signs;
- b) Quickly assess the information on the signs;
- c) Act in accordance with the information relative to the situation or with the direction to be taken.

37**STOP SIGNS**

- a) Anticipate the best time to ease up on the accelerator in order to slow down under engine compression;
- b) Slow down and downshift into the lowest gear in the upper range;
- c) Only press the clutch pedal when the engine reaches about 800 RPM;
- d) Bring your vehicle to a stop about 1 metre from the stop line;
- e) Lower the range selector and shift into the appropriate gear.

38**TRAFFIC LIGHTS**

- a) If possible, anticipate when the light will turn green by easing up on the accelerator in order to slow down under engine compression and downshift gears to try to keep the vehicle moving;
- b) If a full stop become necessary, only press the clutch pedal when the engine reaches about 800 RPM;
- c) Bring your vehicle to a stop about 1 metre from the stop line;
- d) Shift into the appropriate gear at the appropriate time.

39**LEVEL CROSSINGS**

- a) Watch for road signs;
- b) Slow down, if necessary;
- c) Look both ways;
- d) If anything obstructs your field of vision, lower the side windows in order to listen for the sound of a train that might be coming;
- e) Avoid changing gears as you cross over the train tracks.

NB: If you have hazard placards (hazardous materials) mounted on your vehicle, do not change gears as you cross over train tracks.

40**ANTICIPATING INTERSECTIONS**

- a) Watch for road signs;
- b) Anticipate the best time to ease up on the accelerator in order to slow down under engine compression; and
- c) Turn on your turn signal at the appropriate time;
- d) Downshift to be able to select the appropriate gear before making your turn;
- e) Watch what the semi-trailer is doing while you make the turn;
- f) Turn off the turn signal when the turn is completed.

41

NEGOCIATING CURVES

- a) Watch for road signs, if any, and assess the sharpness of the curve;
- b) Slow down before you reach the curve (to below the suggested speed);
- c) Steer the tractor so that the semi-trailer stays within the traffic lane ;
- d) Maintain your vehicle's traction as you go around the curve (except if you are on a downhill grade).

42

STRAIGHT ROAD DRIVING

- a) Watch your vehicle's position in the traffic lane;
- b) Reduce speed (to below the speed limit, if necessary);
- c) Before meeting a heavy vehicle coming from the opposite direction, position your vehicle slightly to the right in your traffic lane.

CHANGING LANES

- a) Look in the rear-view mirrors (flat rear-view mirror and convex rear-view mirror) to see if the way is clear to change lanes;
- b) Turn on the appropriate turn signal;
- c) Check the rear-view mirrors again;
- d) Change lanes when the way is clear to do so;
- e) Turn off the turn signal when the lane change is completed.

44

MULTIPLE LANE CHANGES

Change lanes one lane at a time.

NB: Never cross several lanes at the same time in a single movement.

45

HIGHWAY ENTRANCE

Use the acceleration lane to increase your vehicle's speed to 60 km/h or more.

- a) Turn on the appropriate turn signal at the appropriate time;
- b) Alternately, watch what is ahead of your vehicle and the traffic in the lane that you wish to enter;
- c) Yield the right of way, if necessary;
- d) Continue to accelerate in order to enter the fast lane;
- e) Turn off the turn signal when entry onto the highway is completed.

NB: When driving in the fast lane, turn on your emergency flashers if your speed is below 60 km/h.

46

HIGHWAY EXIT

Unless specifically indicated otherwise, drive at the 60-km/h minimum speed limit before entering the deceleration lane.

- a) Watch for road signs announcing the exit you wish to take;
- b) Anticipate the best time to ease up on the accelerator in order to slow down under engine compression; and
- c) Turn on the turn signal at the appropriate time;
- d) Downshift gears, if necessary;
- e) Enter the deceleration lane;
- f) Continue slowing down and downshifting;
- g) Turn off the turn signal.

47 CRUISE CONTROL

- a) Set your vehicle at your selected speed;
- b) Set cruise control ON-OFF switch to ON position;
- c) Move the cruise control switch into SET position;
- d) To turn off cruise control while keeping the set speed in the memory, simply press the clutch or the brake pedal;
- e) To resume cruise control at the previously set speed, move the cruise control switch to RESUME position;
- f) When the switch is in OFF position or the engine is shut off, the cruise control setting is cancelled and the entered speed is erased from the memory.

NB: Do not use cruise control on slippery roads.

48 ENGINE BRAKE

- a) Assess the condition of the road;
- b) Assess the steepness of the downhill grade, if any;
- c) Engage the engine brake, and monitor the selected holding power.

NB: Unless it is absolutely necessary, avoid engine braking in areas where there are signs prohibiting engine braking, as well as in urban areas (50 km/h and lower speed limits). If possible, avoid engine braking in semi-urban areas (70-km/h speed limits) where properties are close together.

49 DOWNHILL GRADE

- a) Determine steepness degree and select the proper gear that will take you safely downhill;
- b) You **must** initiate the down grade at the proper speed and gear selection to assure a safe downhill operation;
- c) Use engine compression (**at about the rated speed**) to keep brake use to a minimum;
- d) Use the engine brake at the desired holding power in order to keep brake use to a minimum.

NB: If the road surface is too slippery, do not use the engine brake. Downshift gears and reduce engine RPM to prevent wheel lock from engine compression

SERVICE BRAKE

Apply the brakes in sequence (without pumping them) or continuously (gentle braking) in order to maintain a safe speed while making sure not to exceed the maximum engine speed.

50 UPHILL GRADE

- a) Drive at the maximum speed that road conditions will allow (**keep within the required speed limit at all times**);
- b) Keep an eye on the engine RPM indicator and downshift if necessary;
- c) When downshifting through a series of gears in quick succession, keep your hand on the gearshift lever so as to be able to shift gears quickly.

51**INTER-AXLE DIFFERENTIAL LOCK****ENGAGING THE INTER-AXLE DIFFERENTIAL LOCK**

- a) Maintain a constant speed;
- b) Make sure that none of the drive wheels are skidding;
- c) Set the control to LOCK;
- d) Ease up on the accelerator momentarily (optionally, press the clutch).

DISENGAGING THE INTER-AXLE DIFFERENTIAL LOCK

- a) Maintain a constant speed;
- b) Set the control to UNLOCK;
- c) Ease up on the accelerator momentarily (optionally, press the clutch).

52**INTER-WHEEL DIFFERENTIAL LOCK****ENGAGING THE INTER-WHEEL DIFFERENTIAL LOCK**

- a) If the vehicle is moving, it must be moving in a straight line;
- b) Maintain a constant speed;
- c) Make sure that none of the drive wheels are skidding;
- d) Set the control to LOCK;
- e) Ease up on the accelerator momentarily (optionally, press the clutch).

NB: Use of the inter-wheel differential lock causes understeering. Do not use at speeds above 40 km/h.
